Southwest Corner Workforce Development Board SCWDB Priority of Service Policy Update

The Southwest Corner Workforce Development Board (SCWDB) is committed to providing priority of service to those most in need. To accomplish this, the SCWDB will ensure at least 51% of WIOA Adult participants receiving individualized career and/or training services are from one of following three priority of service groups as outlined in WIOA sec. 134(c)(3)(E):

- 1. Public Assistance Recipients
- 2. Other low-income individuals (employed or unemployed)
- 3. Individuals who are basic skills deficient

The SCWDB also realizes there are many additional individuals struggling to attain self-sufficiency. While giving first priority to the targeted groups as outlined above, the SCWDB will also provide WIOA Adult Individualized career and training services to:

- Individuals whose annualized previous last 6-months family income does not exceed 200% of the Federal Poverty Income Level Guidelines published annually by the US Department of Labor.
- In addition, the SCWBD will provide WIOA Adult work-based training service including registered apprenticeships, on-the-job training (OJT), and customized training to WIOA Adults who are either unemployed, or employed at a level below self-sufficiency as defined by the SCWDB self-sufficiency policy.

This policy update is effective September 1, 2018.
